Notorious RBG: The Life and Times of Ruth Bader Ginsburg, the first-ever museum exhibition about the late trailblazing associate justice, has been extended **through Sunday, December 3**, for its presentation at the new **Capital Jewish Museum**, located in downtown Washington, DC. ABOUT THE EXHIBITION

Based on the *New York Times* bestselling book of the same name and created in partnership with its authors, Irin Carmon and Shana Knizhnik, the exhibition takes a deeply personal journey through historic change with an entertaining yet rigorous look at the life and work of Ruth Bader Ginsburg (RBG) and the Supreme Court, on which she so famously served. It examines her varied roles as a student, life partner, mother, change-making lawyer, judge, women’s rights pioneer, and pop culture icon.

Through archival photographs and documents, historical artifacts, contemporary art, and media stations, the exhibition explores the American legal system and civil rights movements through the lens of RBG's personal experiences and public service. Like the book, it tells the parallel stories of her remarkable life and the efforts she joined to expand "We the People" to include those long left out of the Constitution's promises.

For its Washington, DC presentation, the Capital Jewish Museum has added artifacts that connect to RBG's Jewish life in the capital, including a special collar commissioned for her by *Moment Magazine*, the mezuzah from the door to her Supreme Court chambers, and artifacts collected from public memorials following her death in 2020.
